ORDINANCE NO. 740

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE GLEN ELDER CITY CODE AUTHORIZING SUNDAY SALES OF CEREAL MALT BEVERAGE IN THE ORIGINAL PACKAGE WITHIN THE CITY OF GLEN ELDER BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 9:00 A.M. AND 8:00 P.M.

Whereas, Kansas House Bill 2137 became effective July 1, 2021, which authorizes Sunday sales for retail liquor stores and cereal malt beverage retailers to begin as early as 9:00 a.m. in cities where Sunday sales have been authorized. In order for this change to take effect in the City of Glen Elder, the governing body must modify its existing city code in order to authorize Sunday sales before noon.

Whereas, Ordinance 607 adopted by the City of Glen Elder on July 5, 2005, authorizes the sale of cereal malt beverages on Sundays in the City of Glen Elder. The governing body desires to pass an ordinance which would align the hours of Sunday sales with those hours set by the Kansas Legislature in House Bill 2137.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GLEN ELDER, KANSAS:

Section 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 41-2704, the sale at retail of cereal malt beverage in the original package is allowed within the city on any Sunday, except Easter, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.

Section 2. Ordinance No. 607 of the City of Glen Elder, Kansas, passed on July 5, 2005, is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official city newspaper.


Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect 61 days after final publication, unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the ordinance as provided in K.S.A. 41-2911, in which case this ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
