

Glen Elder Community Club Scholarship

The Glen Elder Community Club Scholarship fund was originally established in 1999 through the efforts of our community's special history book committee and the subsequent sale of the Glen Elder Family History book. Memorial donations were also received in honor of Charlie Parker, Gail Weidenhaft, and Lyle McPeak, all long-time residents who were much respected in the community. Various other local contributions also support the scholarship.

Requirements of Applicants:

1. Senior with a Glen Elder address
2. Involvement in Glen Elder Community Club activities (Attend Community Club Meetings- 3rd Monday of the month at 5:30, Easter Egg Hunt- March 31st, Chili Cook-off- October 6th, Christmas Lighting- November 24th, Kids Holiday Workshop- December, etc.)
3. Be present during Fun Day/Cook-off or help with advance work for Fun Day/Cook-off.
4. GPA at least 2.5 or higher
5. Students who will enroll in a four-year institution or students who will enroll in a one or two-year institution of higher learning beyond the 12th grade level
6. If a student drops out of school at any time during the 1st semester for any reason other than health or hardship, the scholarship committee will request the funds to be returned.
7. Deadline for the scholarship application is April 1.

Instructions for page one of the application and essay:

The applicant is to submit a short narrative answer to the following statements. This page and essay should be carefully and thoughtfully written, as the selection committee will put great weight on these pages. **DO NOT INCLUDE ANY IDENTIFICATION ON THIS PAGE!** The selection committee will judge the applications before any identities are known.

1. Why I feel I should be considered for this scholarship and my GPA
2. My need for the scholarship
3. How I plan to use the scholarship funds
4. My goals for completing my education
5. My career goals and objectives
6. School and community activities and/or community service, especially that which was completed for the Glen Elder Community Club events
7. Submit a 100-word essay on “What Glen Elder Means to Me”.

Instructions for page two:

1. Name and address
2. Parents’ names
3. Copy of transcript
4. Submit one photo suitable for the newspaper – to be used upon selection as a scholarship awardee.
