

## CHAPTER VI. ELECTIONS

### Article 1.City Elections

---

#### ARTICLE 1. CITY ELECTIONS

- 6-101. CONDUCT OF ELECTION. The election of city officials shall be conducted in all respects as provided by the laws of Kansas governing the holding of city elections.  
(K.S.A. 25-2101 et seq.; Code 1993)
- 6-102. HOURS OF VOTING. At all city elections the polls shall be open at 7:00a.m. and close at 7:00p.m., unless different hours are set and publicly announced by the county election officer.  
(K.S.A. 25-2111, K.S.A. 26-206; Code 1993)
- 6-103. STAGGERED TERMS. (a) A regular city election shall be held on the first Tuesday in April of each odd-numbered year. At the regular city election in 1981, there shall be elected a mayor, and five councilmen. At said election the candidates for councilmen receiving three highest number of votes shall be declared elected for a term of four years. The candidates for councilmen receiving the next two highest number of votes shall be declared elected for a term of two years. The candidate elected mayor shall be declared elected for a term of two years. Succeeding elections for all such offices shall be for terms of four years. At such elections the candidates for councilmen receiving the two or three (as the case may be) highest number of votes shall be declared elected.  
(b) The terms of the officers shall begin at the first regular meeting of the council in May following their election in April.
